We will build a Midtown that is...

...an authentically **proud**, **vibrant**, **inclusive**, and **fun** part of Missoula, with a high quality of life and a distinct **quality of place**. Future development in Midtown will lead with **equitable** solutions to provide a **mixed-use district** that provides prime opportunities for living, learning, doing business, and outdoor recreation across all income levels.

Midtown will have a strong core with vibrant activity hubs and public places for community gathering, surrounded by diverse, inclusive, and complete residential neighborhoods. Destinations and neighborhoods throughout Midtown will be safe and convenient to navigate by any form of transportation, especially by active and public transportation modes.

- Build on existing planning initiatives for Midtown


Updated Goals
